

## Veterans resource fair coming to Rome on May 16

On Thursday, May 16, GLS librarians will staff a table at the Northwest Georgia We CARE Vet Fair in Rome. As one of more than 90 professional agencies represented at the event, GLS is ready to help U.S. veterans and their families connect with services to improve their lives.

The We CARE Vet Fair was launched in 2022 by United Military Care, a Georgia nonprofit aiding veterans since 2012. Located strategically in different regions of the state, the events offer an essential opportunity for veterans and service members of all ages to engage directly with professionals in a variety of fields. These face-to-face interactions allow veterans to understand, apply for, and access helpful programs and benefits they have earned.

Veterans, active duty personnel, National Guard members, reservists, families, and caregivers can apply for

military benefits, check the status of claims, file appeals, and learn about a multitude of programs and services available in their communities.

Organizers of the Rome event are expecting 3,500 veterans from 16 northwest Georgia counties. Among the special features of this event are veteran ID cards, free lunch, free haircuts, golf, support animals, expert
